Annual Meeting: The annual board meeting is for <u>unit owners only</u>.

- This meeting will be on Thursday, March 10th, 5:30 pm on the parking lot roof.
 Directions will be posted around the building on meeting day. Guest parking is available for nonresident owners. There are seven stalls in the front parking lot and six stalls in the ground-floor parking structure.
 - Check-in begins at 5:30; the meeting will start soon after at 6:00.
- Owners, proxies must be turned in by Tuesday, March 8th, by 4:30 pm. Your proxies are essential as we will need 51% of submissions to meet the quorum.
 - You may mail these back to Hawaiian or submit them to the management office.

Bulky Pick Up: Do not dump or leave bulky items in the trash rooms, the trash chute, the trash corral, or on the curb. The City & County run bulky pick-ups by appointment only.

- For appointments: helpful instructions
 - Select "Bulky Collection" or "Appliance Collection."
 - Skip the prefix number. Fill in the <u>house number</u> and <u>street name</u>. Then select <u>your unit number.</u>
 - Select your bulky item(s). Make sure all items are accounted for.
 - STOP: Do not schedule a date yet. If an elevator reservation is needed to move the bulky item(s), please schedule an elevator reservation with me for the <u>day</u> <u>before</u> pick up.
 - Continue and submit all required information for your appointment.

Resident Reminders

- **Elevator Reservations:** Service elevator use is allowed <u>Monday-Saturday</u>, 8:00 <u>am-5:00 pm</u>; we do not permit use on Sundays and Holidays.
- **Do Not Feed Birds:** Please do not feed the bird in the parking lot. Bird feces is unwanted.
- Quiet Hours: Quiet hours are from 9:00 pm-8:00 am daily.
- Vehicle Decal: Please remember to pick up decal stickers if you haven't already.
